Advice for milliners taking their own pictures - light light, where is the light coming from, how is it reflecting the colour the texture etc of your hat.

When your own portrait is being taken - expression is important. Relax - a good photographer will relax their subject.

When choosing a photographer - look at their portfolio, ask if they've shot millinery/headwear and portraits before. Look for their versatility, how do they get the best and all angles of the hats.

Getting value out of a shoot, planning, be ready to go, have your pieces lined up and ready, efficiency, work out times for HMU etc - usually an hour lead in, with photographer set up time for lights etc.

Most important piece of advice - lighting, declutter the scene, background that provides contrast, doesn't dominate or blend in. think about different backgrounds - e.g. seamless paper \$60/roll in different colours.

Advice to competition entrants to make the most of the photographs - hard to say, tall pieces can be challenging to photograph.

Half the work is in front of the camera, the other half is in front of the computer, enhancing the images. Great software out there for smart phones, make the most of that.

Taking your own shots for your website - depends on your funds. Working with a live model is preferable - can find models building their portfolio who may be willing to work for free or less. Think about accessorising if more than a head and shoulders shot.

Simply loves to photograph people who dress up and so appreciative of the milliners.
