President Report

GENERAL MEMBERS MEETING - TUESDAY 25 JUNE at 7PM

Amanda is holding down two jobs as well as working furiously to get her millinery business up and running and something just had to give and unfortunately it was us. Though Amanda was not on the committee for very long we are all delighted to have gotten to know her, she is a fun and vibrant lady and we have missed having her around these last few months. Good luck, Amanda, we look forward to following your millinery journey as one day if you ever find some spare time to rejoin us it would be pleasure!

This leads me to announce that we have a new committee member. Sharon Schreurs has joined us on Committee 2019.

A little bit about Sharon - Sharon Schreurs was born in Scotland and after stints in London, Finland, Hungary and Singapore she has finally settled in Melbourne, Australia with her husband and two children, where they grow celery and leeks. Having been an oncology nurse for 17 years she recently graduated from Kangan Institute, Melbourne with a Cert. 4 in Millinery and won Kangan's "Most Outstanding Student 2018". She came second in the inaugural 2018 MAA student millinery award where her Octopus' Garden piece eluded to the damage being done by human waste to our sea life. And at the end of last year she was asked to represent Victoria at the Business of Fashion Expo in Hong Kong where she collaborated with the Indigenous artist, Lorraine Brigdale, to create a piece which represented the Australian Outback. She has also worked for Kim Fletcher for two Spring Carnivals.

Now she is embarking on her own millinery career and working towards establishing a small clientbase. She enjoys writing and works best when working with others, so is enormously excited aboutbeing a part of the Millinery Association of Australia team and making a contribution to the continued advancement of this organisation.

I'd really like to thank Lauren, Philip and Virginia for joining me on the judging panel. We had a fabulous day and were all just so impressed with the quality of the pieces entered this year.



Embolden Festival: St Kilda Town Hall Sunday 1st September

Embolden is an annual festival challenging ageism and building respect for older people. Embolden is hosted by the Celebrate Ageing Program.

MAA is excited to be part of this. It fits well with out Philosophy.

The highlight of the festival is a Fashion Parade that we are going to both join and support. 250+ attendees to the Festival.

A Fashion Parade called SPUNK

Spunk is an attitude - it is about courage, determination, pluck, spirit, strength, fortitude, guts and grit. A spunk is also a sexually attractive.



Embolden: A Fashion Parade called Spunk.

Proposal: We would value the opportunity to work with Millinery Australia to present a Runway. The models could be Milliners or models of the Milliners choosing ... or could be sourced by the Embolden Team.

What we would offer in return is:

- Display information about your organisation on our website, at the Embolden event and in the resources developed

THE MILLINERY ASSOCIATION

ABOUT A FASHION PARADE CALLED SPUNK

- All the models were 65+ and we focused on beauty as an attitude.
- We asked our models to tell us what their cat walk attitude was and how they could take their catwalk attitude into everyday life as a protective factor against ageism.
- It's about not waiting for the world to be less ageist it's about living our lives to the full right now.
- The Fashion Parade challenged the ageist misconception that beauty is limited to youth. We suggest that
 beauty changes as we age but is not less. We wanted to show how older people have grace, style and a sense
 of play.
- The 2018 Parade celebrated 38 models of a range of body shapes, genders and skin colours and many people looked at the models on the night and in the photos and films taken and said: I want to be that person. This statement is one of appreciation and respect for older people – and a gentle indication that change is possible (and an enormous task).

MAA will have it's own runway with approx. 6 milliner models, or their friends.

We will also help style other groups if requested with millinery / hats that we may have available to loan.
