5. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Thank you for your attention and consideration for the vote and thank you to Kathy for the preparations. If you voted against the changes, I understand you will be disappointed, however I hope you will accept the outcome, and get behind the next chapter of Millinery Australia.

I now ask you for your patience as we update our website and registration forms to reflect the changes. Once this is done, we will ask you to begin inviting your friends, family and fashion lovers, stylists and customers to join our Association as a Friend, and if you know a milliner who has been reluctant to join in the past, please give them a little push. The more the merrier!

This is our last meeting before the spring carnival season and our AGM in November, as most of us, including the committee will be too busy to participate.

5.1 Government House Cup Eve Reception

The VRC have once again invited us to the Cup eve event at Government House. The committee each year determine the invite list for Millinery Australia. For full transparency I will share with you how we determined the list for this year.

We were asked for 12 members to display at Government House. This consisted of the top 10 from the design award, the Photographers Pic and, due to Rebecca also winning the Jonesy, we added in the People's Choice Award. Two of the finalists opted to not display so it was decided to invite Jo Peterson as the Alison Morgan winner and Sarah Mensforth to represent the Committee in gratitude for all her hard work this year.

For the event itself the top ten were first on the list and their plus one is of their choosing.

Next is the committee, but their plus one is a member fellow or life member who has volunteered in a significant way throughout the year. For example, Archives, Heritage, Festival, Design and student Award, Gala, Block Library, I.T, etc. I feel this is a very fair way to distribute these invites and will be recommending that future committees consider the same method.

5.2 Melbourne Cup Day Photo Shoot opportunity with Richard Shaw

We are happy to announce that Richard will once again be our photographer for Melbourne Cup day. To better manage this opportunity for our members, we have made some changes from last year.

- This year, the cost will be \$45 for three high-resolution images of one look. A
 "look" can be a photo of your model, yourself, OR a couple/group photo, but it
 does not mean one of each.
- If you want all three options, it will be \$45 per option or look.
- We will not be restricted to time slots this year. Instead, you will purchase a
 ticket (soon to be released) and show it to Richard on the day. This will allow
 you to skip the queue of non-paying fashionistas. You will receive your images
 via email as soon as possible after the event.
- The designated location will be advised prior to the event.

5.3 2025 Lillian Frank Award Entries

I had a chat this week with Christie Lougon from the VRC who has been running the competition since 2016 apart from the last few years when she was on leave. Interestingly the information she had was that 40 milliners competed and paraded in the Lillian Frank Millinery Award last year and that most if not all entries were invited to parade and to be judged on the stage. We had much discussion about this, and I am now confident that this year's competition will provide a larger parade and bigger competition, than last year. I feel the competition is on a good path and any confusion or mistakes from last year will be addressed.

This is my understanding of the process.

- Entries are submitted online and you will be notified if you make the final parade. This part of the judging is to purely check that you are indeed a milliner and that your work is worthy of the competition and if necessary to keep the numbers manageable.
- The judges for this portion may not be the judges of the competition on the day.
- The judging of the comp is all done on the day from all entries on the stage.
- The VRC have been very active in getting great prizes for us to compete for and we need to put last year behind us and show them support by entering the comp.
- Chistie is going to try to get out to us the finalist asap after the closing date and she has offered to answer any questions we have for her. She has also asked

me to ask you tonight if you are planning to enter to help them with that planning.

5.4 Stephen Jones Christmas Get Together – December 4th – 7-10pm

A big thank you to Sandy Forrester for researching venues for our end of year party with our Patron Mr Stephen Jones OBE in attendance.

The ticket price will be \$79 for canapies plus one hour of drinks and is **strictly a member only event**, which will now include our new category of Friends.

Millinery Australia will be subsidising \$3 for each ticket, and any short fall of the minimum spend if necessary. Tickets will be on sale soon.

5.5 Melbourne Fashion Festival

I had another meeting with Todd Heggie and Sai Wai from the **Melbourne Fashion Festival**. Todd requested that I send him our Look Book this week so he can forward it to creative directors for consideration. Thank you to all members who have provided their details and images. The document is simple by both request and design. It is a live document, allowing easy addition and removal of participants, and should be easily managed by any future volunteer.

Following a suggestion from the MFF team, we are applying to run two events during the festival: one in Melbourne and one in Geelong. In Melbourne, we hope to host an afternoon tea party called "Fashion OFF the Field with Millinery Australia." We will have prizes such as millinery vouchers and will seek additional prizes as we go. We also hope to have an exhibition of millinery, allowing members to further showcase their work. The goal of the event is to raise the profile of Millinery Australia and attract both men and women especially from the racing fashion crowd.
